
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RESULTS OF SURVEY OF REFUGE/GREENWAY NEIGHBORS, June-July 2024

As always, people living around the Refuge are enthusiastic about it AND the Greenway. Older people living in developments farther away are more suspicious.

For Carol G: This survey was by design biased because its existence was broadcast by Nextdoor and Facebook groups, of course a self-selecting sample. It targeted people living AROUND Rocky Flats and I explicitly acknowledged its affiliation with "Friends of the Rocky Flats of the National Wildlife Refuge". It was successful in that 71% of respondents (no matter what their opinions) were from zip 80007. The margin of error can be computed from the number of respondents already specified on the graphic. By contrast, about 60% of LeRoy Moore's 2016 anti-Refuge petition, purporting to reflect local opinion, were from Boulder or outside the state.

The horrifying prospect that Candelas and other Refuge neighbors are well-educated on the subject of Rocky Flats, did due diligence, and then moved here is unbearable, eh?

Too bad the same insistence on statistical



punctiliousness wasn't brought to bear on results of the 2016 Downwinder's survey, anecdata from folks told for 26 years to blame Rocky Flats for their illnesses. Metro State withdrew from further affiliation with the Downwinders as a result.
